# **Promoting research activities**

### **GOALS:**

- 1. Encourage the faculties to undertake minor and major research projects from UGC and projects from other sources.
- 2. Encourage the faculties to engage in inter and multidisciplinary research projects
- 3. To contribute quality research papers which would contribute in the expansion of their respective research area.

**CONTEXT:** Creation and dissemination of knowledge is an integral objective of any academic institution. This not only increases one's understanding of the subject in a better way but also enhances his analytical ability which goes a long way in the development and growth of academics.

**PRACTICE:** In the beginning, the teachers are being encouraged to carry out advanced research in their respective area of specialization and to publish the result of their research work in journals of national and international repute. They are also motivated to present their work at national and international seminars, workshops and conferences.

**EVIDENCE:** Many of the faculties after getting ample encouragement from the Institution have gone for research work leading to M.Phil., Ph.D. and Postdoctoral degree. They have also published their research work in reputed international publishers like Elsevier, Springer, Hindwai, AJC etc., which contributed enormously towards the development of their respective field of research.

**CHALLENGES:** Limited resource impedes the purchase of sophisticated instruments which may help in advanced research.

Due to the shortage of regular faculties, the teachers are overloaded with their curricular and co-curricular assignments which preclude them from devoting enough time for research.

#### **Best Practice-II**

# Financial Assistance to needy and meritorious students

**GOAL:** The primary objective of extending financial assistance to the poor and meritorious students is to help them to get engaged in their academic pursuit who in absence of such assistance might have been disadvantageously placed. This is in compliance to the objective and mission of the College to help the students belonging to economically and socially weaker section.

#### **CONTEXT:**

As a matter of fact, the funds available for accomplishing the objectives is not sufficing in relation to the number of students who really stand in need of assistance. So the institution is hard pressed to explore the possibilities of procuring more resources to carter the needs of as many students as possible.

### **PRACTICE:**

There is a committee comprising of some faculty members to coordinate the financial assistance extended under the provision of free tuition fees and social services guild. At the beginning of every session the committee invites applications from the students. After due scrutiny and assessing their need and merit sanctions financial assistance.

### **EVIDENCE:**

A large number of students have been sanctioned free studentship and financial assistance from the social services guild of the College.

Cash Prizes have been awarded to some meritorious students who have topped the University examinations.

### **CHALLENGES**

Due to the shortage of fund many of the meritorious students could not be assisted with enough financial support.
